



National Trust of Queensland Bendigo Bank Heritage Awards 2010

NOMINATION INFORMATION & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

In partnership with: Bendigo Bank, the Queensland Heritage Council and the Treasury Casino and Hotel.

Members of the community of Queensland, including individuals, businesses, government authorities, professional bodies and community organisations are invited to participate in the 2010 National Trust of Queensland, Bendigo Bank Heritage Awards.

The Awards recognise the range of cultural heritage work that takes place across all areas of the State. The National Trust, Bendigo Bank and the Queensland Heritage Council dedicate the awards to all sectors of the community who contribute to the heritage of Queensland. The Heritage Awards have been presented by the National Trust of Queensland for over 30 years. The John Herbert Memorial Award is presented to the most outstanding nomination from across all categories.

NOMINATIONS

Nominations are invited in three categories. There is no nomination fee. **Nominations close 9 July 2010 at 4.00 pm.**

All nominations should include:

- **The nomination form** from the owner or nominator;
- **Information about the project:** Why it was undertaken? What did it involve? How was it done? When was it done? (View the Award Category guidelines for ideas on what to include in your nomination)
- **Images of the project:** Should be digital high resolution images or photographic prints (free of copyright or with the owner's prior permission). This material may be used for promotional purposes.
- **Any additional information** you may consider relevant, such as community support.

PRESENTATION OF AWARDS

Awards in the form of framed certificates (limit of 1 per award) are presented at a function. All winners of an award will be notified and receive two free tickets to the function. Extra tickets are available for friends and colleagues at cost price.

Multiple unframed certificates can be arranged. It is essential that nominators complete the section on the nomination form for the name(s) of certificate recipients.

There can be multiple awards in each category ranging from High Commendation to Silver and Gold. An overall award, the John Herbert Memorial Award will be made for the most outstanding nomination. All nominations in all categories will be considered for this Award.

CATEGORIES & JUDGING CRITERIA

Categories include all aspects of cultural heritage work. Cultural heritage is defined to include both the historic environment and Indigenous heritage. Work includes conservation planning, research, education, all types of physical conservation works on structures or places, as well as interpretation or presentation. Nominations can only be made to one category.

A panel of judges with appropriate expertise undertakes the judging. With the Queensland Heritage Council category, judging is undertaken by a specialist committee with recommendations to the Queensland Heritage Council.

Nominations can address one or more criteria in the chosen category. Judging criteria is as follows:

1. Queensland Heritage Council Awards

All works undertaken to a place that is in the Queensland Heritage Register:

- Demonstrated best practice approach to conservation works in accordance with Burra Charter principles.
- Long-term conservation outcomes, particularly ensuring a viable use.
- Demonstrated high level technical skill in planning, building or other conservation activities.
- Innovative approach to overcoming logistic, technical and other problems.

2. The Governor's Heritage Awards

All heritage projects undertaken by individuals, local government authorities or commercial entities (other than category 1 entries).

- Understanding of the heritage values of a place or activity within a community, including research.
- Actions to conserve or promote the cultural significance of a place or activity in a community (e.g. home renovation, heritage trail, festival, publication, oral history).
- Evidence of good planning and selection of options that may support both sustainability and retention of heritage values, including home renovation.

3. National Trust Community Awards

For voluntary work undertaken by individuals or organisations in Queensland in the fields of history or cultural heritage:

- Projects that illustrate valuable volunteer work in all fields of history and cultural heritage.
- Activity that inspires others to enjoy the value of history and heritage through volunteer work.
- Volunteer history and heritage projects that contribute significantly to our understanding of the continuity of Queensland society.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY FOR NOMINATIONS

1. For the purpose of promoting the Awards, the National Trust reserves the right to exhibit all or any of the nominations, including images.
2. An owner may nominate their own place or project.
3. Where the nominator is not the owner of a place, land or project they shall obtain the owner's consent to the nomination and any resultant publicity.
3. Nominations for a particular activity can only be submitted once. However, planning aspects of a project (such as conservation planning, background research) can be submitted, as well as actual works undertaken at a later stage.
4. The judges reserve the right to change categories for a nomination if they consider the nomination more correctly fits in an alternative category.
5. The National Trust may request further information to support the nomination.
