In the early 21st century vandals pushed Bertie off his plinth and smashed him into several small pieces. The stone plinth he stood upon is all that remains of his memorial today. Ghost Tours, in combination with the Ipswich City Council, has raised enough money to restore Bertie to his former glory and honour his parents wish that he be standing ready for the Day of Reckoning. Come along to see the unveiling of one of the greatest pieces of Victorian-era stone masonry in Queensland. In May 1943 the 'Centaur', now commissioned as an Australian Hospital Ship, left Sydney for Brisbane with over 300 personnel aboard. In the early hours of 14 May 1943, a Japanese submarine torpedoed the hospital ship, causing the highest death toll of any merchant vessel sunk by a submarine in the Pacific theatre of war. The 'Centaur' was discovered recently eastward of Moreton Island and Point Lookout, 2,059 metres below the sea surface. Visit our display to learn more about AHS Centaur.
