WOLSTON HOUSE, WACOL

A rare surviving early Queensland homestead, Wolston House was built in 1852 for Dr Stephen Simpson, police magistrate and Commissioner for Crown Lands. The house is constructed of sandstone and brick and overlooks the Brisbane River on a rural site between Brisbane and Ipswich.



MOON'S RESERVE, BROOKFIELD

This reserve honours Brookfield pioneers Thomas & Susan Moon, parents of William.R.Moon the first president of the National Trust of Queensland in 1964.



ROYAL BULL'S HEAD INN, DRAYTON

The Royal Bull's Head Inn, a two storey timber and brick building, was constructed in 1859. As one of the earliest buildings in the Toowoomba area, it was a welcome oasis for travellers and used for meetings, auctions and social functions. Today it still is a special place to visit for Devonshire teas, or for browsing through its book shop.



BRENNAN & GERAGHTY'S STORE MUSEUM, MARYBOROUGH

Established in 1871, this large grocery store was operated by one family for over 100 years. Its intact interior houses a collection of more than 100,000 items, all original to the store. Unsold stock from the 1890s to 1920s, as well as historic trading records and advertising material are on display.

HERITAGE CENTRE TOWNSVILLE

This historic house complex displays three typical North Queensland Houses, each furnished in appropriate style, with an emphasis on items made in North Queensland. The complex includes a simple miner's cottage from the early 1880s, a comfortable villa residence from late in the same decade and a 1920s farmhouse.



STOCK EXCHANGE BUILDING, CHARTERS TOWERS

This grand masonry building was originally built in 1888 as a shopping arcade, and by 1890 became home to the Stock Exchange to serve activity of the shares of the companies active on the gold fields. The building has a glassed roof interior with tessellated tile floor.



CHARTERS TOWERS MUSEUM

The Charters Towers Museum (c.1883) is housed in a late nineteenth century commercial building. Gold was discovered in 1871 and production peaked in 1889 to make it one of Australia's richest goldfields. The museum contains items pertaining to the history of Charters Towers. The large collection includes transport vehicles, documents and domestic items.



HOU WANG TEMPLE AND MUSEUM, ATHERTON

The only surviving building from a Chinese settlement founded in Atherton in the 1880s, Hou Wang Temple was constructed of timber and corrugated iron and opened in 1903. For decades it was the social and religious heart of Atherton's Chinese community. The existing fittings for the temple, including the elaborate carvings, bell, ding and metal vessels were made in China.



JAMES COOK MUSEUM, COOKTOWN

One of Cooktown's significant buildings, today's museum was the convent of St Mary when erected in the late 1880s. With its special connection to the navigator Lieutenant James Cook, the museum's collection includes an Endeavour cannon, one of six jettisoned when Cook's barque struck the Barrier Reef in 1770. Other items in the collection include the original Endeavour anchor, Chinese and indigenous artefacts, early Cooktown and convent history.
